Despite the challenges presented by COVID-19 in 2021, ILACSD continued to serve students, adults and businesses by providing environmental education, volunteer cleanups, and waste recovery resources. ILACSD is dedicated to empowering every person to be leaders in conservation and waste-free living in order to protect and improve the health of San Diego County.

Environmental Education

I Love A Clean San Diego's education team remained incredibly flexible through the pandemic with county and school district safety guidelines constantly changing. Our education staff overcame the challenges of serving various school districts and community groups with differing restrictions and limited availability. In 2021, virtual and in-person program options were offered based on the needs of individual schools and groups. This strategy allowed us to re-introduce our signature in-person presentations to some groups, while maintaining newer strategies such as virtual webinars, which have reached a wider audience and are widely popular!


By maintaining a strong degree of flexibility in 2021, our team of education staff were able to engage and inspire almost 26,000 individuals (an increase of almost 4,000 individuals from 2020) and deliver over 650 education presentations (an increase of 100 presentations from 2020). Our education staff grew in 2021 as requests for programs increased. We helped inspire people of all ages across San Diego County to engage and take action related to environmental protection, pollution prevention, zero waste and conservation habits, and diverting waste in many forms from reaching the landfill!



Waste Recovery

I Love A Clean San Diego's waste recovery team continued to provide a high level of customer service to residents and business through the WasteFreeSD hotline and website WasteFreeSD.org. In 2021, more San Diegans than ever were cleaning out their homes and businesses looking for ways to repurpose, recycle, and manage items more responsibly to reduce what ends up in the landfill. The team fielded 5,683 calls and 33,670 web inquiries regarding over 41,422 items.

In addition to being the community's hub for zero waste questions, the team began in-person recycling education and outreach to multi-family complexes, like condominium and apartment buildings, through door-to-door outreach to share organic recycling requirements and resources. Staff also helped schools prepare for upcoming recycling requirements within the County by conducting 31 school waste audits and worked with student and staff-led green teams to set up school recycling programs within the unincorporated portions of the County of San Diego. Our waste recovery staff grew in 2021 as the team took on a new program name, new programs and events, and explored new opportunities to engage and support the community. We helped inspire residents and businesses to recycle right and rethink their relationship with waste!

Volunteer Action



In 2021, the Community Engagement team continued to keep the spirit of environmental volunteerism alive throughout shifting regulations. To keep volunteers safe and socially-distanced, the team continued offering a self-led, close to home volunteering option developed during the height of the pandemic in 2020. This self-led cleanup option proved powerful and was available for all programming. With just over 1,000 individual community cleanups and programs like Storm Drain Stenciling, Independent Cleanups, and Adopt-A-Beach, the Community Engagement team created ample opportunity for volunteers to put passion into action.

Later in the year, the Community Engagement team revived inperson, hosted cleanups, bringing smaller groups and teams together at locations throughout the county. The continued use of GIS visualization impact maps and reporting gave a snapshot behind each volunteer's effort. Through both hosted and individualized efforts, our cleanups and programs mobilized nearly 8,400 volunteers and cleared over 61,000 pounds of litter from San Diego streets, creeks, canyons, parks and beaches. The department's team grew adding new positions and team members, along with a department name change. With a dedicated team and volunteers, Community Engagement was one step closer toward our mission to be litter-free and make a lasting impact on our region.






